INFRASTRUCTURE

TxDOT has launched My35Construction.org, a new construction website to keep the public informed while I-35 is under construction in the Capital Area. The website features up-to-date information about lane closures, travel delays, and crashes for active Mobility35 construction projects. Visitors to the website can sign up for updates and notifications.

The US Senate has confirmed Elaine Chao as the 18th US Transportation Secretary by a vote of 93-6, and she was sworn in to office in **Washington** January 31. *Story*.

After spending years as a target of **Dallas** activists, I-345 is now among a list of US highways that a national group thinks should be torn down. But a lot may have to happen before city leaders decide the freeway's fate. *Story*.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (and 'Other' News)

Frontier Airlines will offer a nonstop service from **San Antonio** to **Chicago** O'Hare International Airport (ORD) starting April 23. *Story*.

Google Maps has unveiled a new maps feature that helps you find parking. The new feature in Google Maps estimates how much trouble you will have finding a parking spot based on past data. The parking difficulty icon will be displayed within Google Maps in 25 metro areas across the country. *Story*.

After 16 years in office, **Round Rock** mayor Alan McGraw is calling it quits. He pointed to downtown revitalization efforts and the recently-signed Kalahari Resorts development deal as signs that the city is progressing economically. Mayor pro-tem Craig Morgan has already announced his candidacy to replace McGraw. *Details*.

Some **Caldwell County** employees had to scramble financially last week when a 'miscommunication' occurred that resulted in county paychecks being late - all the result of an ongoing debate over whether to issue 24 or 26 paychecks per year. *Details*.

After crossing the threshold to over 30,000 in population, **Seguin** continues to boom in development and job opportunities - particularly due to infrastructure improvements near the city - with an unemployment figure of just 3.4%, according to Mayor Don Keil in an update seen *here*.

San Antonio and South Texas officials have been lamenting the conflicts generated by the Trump administration with Mexico on trade and immigration, and they are not alone: our neighbors in Southern California are expressing many of the same concerns *here* to the **Los Angeles** *Times*.
