INFRASTRUCTURE

Prompted by the death of a 13-year old girl struck by a freight train near **Buda** over the weekend, the **San Antonio** *Express-News* has an eye-opening photo feature this morning that chronicles freight train accidents in the region in recent years. *Story*.

Austin and **San Antonio** - among the fastest growing populations in the US - added another 110,000 people in the last year, raising the regional population to 4.4 million. IH-35 traffic between the two metro areas continues to swell and, according to the **Austin American-Statesman**, the Lone Star Rail alternative is faltering. **Story**.

The Texas Senate State Affairs Committee meets tomorrow (3/29) at 9:00 am in **Austin** to discuss eminent domain authority granted to railroads with a probable focus on the Texas Central high speed project between **Houston** and **Dallas**.
