INFRASTRUCTURE

Hourly bus service between **Austin** and **San Antonio** is being proposed once again by former Alamo City mayor (and Corridor Council founder) Henry Cisneros. 'Behind the scenes talks' have been ongoing between **San Antonio**'s VIA and **Austin**'s Capital Metro, he said, though that news seemed to come as a surprise to a Cap Metro spokesperson according to one report. Several private companies currently provide such services and a contract arrangement with one of them seemed the most likely outcome of the talks. **Story**.

While **Austin-San Antonio** transit systems pursue traditional or autonomous bus systems for internal and external connections, our neighbors to the north in **Dallas-Ft. Worth** are investing heavily into new rail systems. Just months after opening a connection from **Fort Worth** to DFW Airport, planners have announced a new line - to go operational by 2022 - that will connect the airport to the suburb cities of **Coppell, Carrollton, Addison, Richardson**, and **Plano**. An electric, pilot-less air drone designed by Boeing has completed 114 successful test flights at a range in **Pendleton**, Oregon. The 8-fan, single occupancy drone is envisioned by Boeing as an airborne alternative to existing ride-share services, soaring over increasingly congested urban streets and highways. Some say the technology is running years ahead of regulators and public acceptance. **Story**.

The scale and scope of TxDOT's planned \$7 billion re-make of **Houston**'s highway system is becoming apparent as the projects move forward, particularly for the city's historic black neighborhoods and the Fifth Ward: TxDOT expects to acquire 162 single family homes, 643 multifamily units, and 508 public housing units for improvements to the downtown loop system (including Interstates 10, 45, and 69). **Details**.

A judge's temporary stay order has prevented the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority from draining a series of lakes along the Guadalupe River northeast of **San Antonio**, but that hasn't prevented anger over the situation from flooding the agency with complaints for allowing the dams to reach such a crisis point that two have already collapsed. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (and 'Other' News)

Austin joins a list of 29 other major world cities (including **Athens, Lisbon, Venice**, and **Copenhagen**) that have managed to steadily reduce their greenhouse gas emissions since 2015, according to a new report from a coalition of cities known as C40 - mayors of the globe's largest urban areas - just ahead of the upcoming World Mayors Summit in **Copenhagen**. Altogether, the 30 cities represent 58 million urban citizens. **Story**.

Some of the biggest players in the **San Antonio** biomedical complex - UT Health San Antonio, Brooke Army Medical Center, the Southwest Research Institute, and the Texas Biomedical Research Institute - have announced a \$1.25 billion 'Precision Therapy Collaborative' that promises new technologies, new jobs, and new opportunities for the **Austin-San Antonio** Corridor. *Opinion*.

A former mayoral candidate in **San Antonio** in 2009, public relations executive Trish DeBerry, has tossed her hat into the ring to replace retiring **Bexar County** commissioner Kevin Wolff. Candidates have until Dec. 9 to file for the March primary election. **Details**.

Atlantic magazine's James Fallows says one of the simplest, most-effective things communities can do to impact air quality and increasing temperatures is to plant trees. Lots of them. He reports on various tree-planting projects and impacts in the US, including his hometown of **Redlands**, California, and offers organizing tips for those interested in pursuing large-scale tree projects. **Story**.

A startup company in **Austin**, Icon, has come up with 3D printing technology capable of building tiny homes in about a day for a fraction of the cost of traditional construction methods, they say. The company hopes to target the growing demand for affordable housing across the US. **Details**.

Texas Government Insider profiled **San Antonio**'s Chief Innovation Officer, Brian Dillard, last week. He's a third generation Eastside San Antonian but spent ten years in the military as a cyber security specialist with postings in **Omaha**, South Korea, and the United Kingdom. **Details**.

A 500-acre section of an iconic ranch along the Blanco River may become a **Hays County** park as part of a cooperative pact put together by commissioner Lon Shell with the Hill Country Conservancy, a conservation group based in **Austin**. The proposed park is part of the El Rancho Cima, a former Boy Scout Ranch on the outskirts of **Wimberley**. For more details, go *here*.

<u>Best New Idea:</u> In France, mail carriers for the national postal service also perform welfare checks on the elderly or infirm and let other family-members or friends know if there are any new needs, concerns, or health problems. Each visit takes 6-15 minutes and those visited sign a receipt acknowledging items and outcomes discussed, just like signing for a package. The subscription service, called *'Watch Over My Parents,'* began in 2013 following a heatwave that killed thousands, many elderly. **Story**.
