INFRASTRUCTURE

TxDOT's Phase Two of truck toll discounts on State Highway 130 from **Mustang Ridge** to **Georgetown** began November 1 and extends through August 31, 2017, lasting from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. It covers the same area and provides a savings of 67% for trucks with a valid TxTag. **Story**.

Today is the final day to voice your opinions on reducing the mandatory speed limits for big rigs. TxDOT says it could be dropped between 60 and 68 miles per hour on highways. If passed, the proposal would only impact trucks over 26,000 pounds. Comment *here*.

A three-judge panel's ruling last week has cleared the way for construction to begin as early as tomorrow on State Highway 45 Southwest in **Austin**. Environmental groups had sought to prevent the project due to endangered species threats, but the court ruled otherwise. **Story**.

Homebuilding in the **Austin**-area has reached its highest level in six years, with 4067 housing starts in the third quarter, an 11.1% jump over last year in the same period. **Story**.
